A460 Wolverhampton Rd, Middle Hill, Carriageway Resurfacing.

Staffordshire County Council working with Amey Services Ltd will shortly be carrying out major highway improvement works at the roundabout of A460 Wolverhampton Road, Middle Hill. This work will include the roundabout at the junction of A460 and A4601 / M6 Toll entry, including its approaches and exits. The works will see an investment of £600,000 to improve the network and reconstruct this section of road.

The works will see the cleansing/repair of any damaged drainage systems, replacement of signs and barriers where required and resurfacing of the carriageway. This work is due to commence 23rd January 2023 and to be completed over a period of 2 weeks.

Due to the nature and scale of the works being planned, the road will need to be closed 19:00-06:00 23/01/2023-10/02/2023.

Signs will be clearly placed to notify motorists of the time and date of these restrictions, and a diversion route will be provided for the closure.

Unfortunately, with any major highway works, some disturbance is unavoidable. There may be times of when noise pollution is unavoidable as we carry out these essential repairs, such as when machinery is active. Due to the nature of this site, night time working is essential.

We apologise in advance for any inconvenience these works may create, however these measures are essential for us to make such improvements to this route, and we kindly ask for your patience during this time.
